## PACS-CONTRIBUTE

WASHINGTON (UPI) — A SURVEY OF FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS TO CONGRESSIONAL CAMPAIGNS BY PRO-ISRAEL AND PRO-ARAB POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEES SHOWED MONDAY THE PRO-ISRAELI GROUPS HAVE AN OVERWHELMING LEAD.

A SURVEY BY THE <u>MIDEAST OBSERVER</u>, A WASHINGTON-BASED NEWSLETTER ON U.S. MIDDLE EAST POLICY SHOWED THAT 33 PRO-ISRAEL PACS CONTRIBUTED MORE THAN \$1.8 MILLION TO 268 DIFFERENT CONGRESSIONAL CAMPAIGNS IN THE 1981-82 REPORTING PERIOD.

BY CONTRAST, THE SURVEY IDENTIFIED ONLY TWO PRO-ARAB PACS THAT CONTRIBUTED A TOTAL OF \$5,500 TO SIX CONGRESSIONAL CAMPAIGNS.

THE SURVEY IS BASED ON INFORMATION GIVEN TO THE FEDERAL ELECTION COMMISSION.

THE LARGEST AMOUNT OF PRO-ISRAEL PAC MONEY WENT TO THE 1982 CAMPAIGN OF RICHARD DURBIN, D-ILL., WHO UNSEATED INCUMBENT REPUBLICAN PAUL FINDLEY, THE RANKING MINORITY MEMBER ON THE HOUSE MIDEAST SUBCOMMITTEE AND AN OUTSPOKEN PROPONENT OF MORE PALESTINIAN PARTICIPATION IN MIDEAST NEGOTIATIONS.

ACCORDING TO THE <u>MIDEAST OBSERVER</u> SURVEY, 31 OF THE EXISTING 33 PRO-ISRREL PACS CONTRIBUTED A TOTAL OF \$103,325 DURBINS SUCCESSFUL CAMPAIGN.

THE TOTAL PRO-ISRAEL PAC CONTRIBUTION OF \$1,873,623 WOULD MAKE THE GROUP LARGER THAN ANY OF THE BIGGEST 30 PAC CONTRIBUTORS IDENTIFIED IN ANOTHER STUDY BY COMMON CAUSE.

ACCORDING TO THE [COMMON CAUSE] STUDY, THE LEADING 30 PACS GAVE \$4.46 MILLION TO CANDIDATES FOR FEDERAL OFFICE IN THE FIRST NINE MONTHS OF 1983.

THE SINGLE LARGEST PRO-ISRAEL PAC IN 1982 WAS IDENTIFIED AS THE NATIONAL PAC, WHICH GAVE A TOTAL OF \$542,500 TO 109 CONGRESSIONAL CANDIDATES.

THE LARGEST SINGLE PAC IDENTIFIED BY COMMON CAUSE IN THE FIRST NINE MONTHS OF 1983 WAS THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF REALTORS WITH \$311,863.
